Professor (emeritus) FRIEDRICH PUKELSHEIM, Institute for Mathematics, University Augsburg is an expert on the mathematical analysis of proportional representation systems. Since 2000 he has authored and co-authored numerous articles in journals on mathematics, constitutional law, statistics, and political science. He was called upon to act as an expert witness by the German Federal Constitutional Court, and by political bodies of the European Parliament, the German Bundestag, various German State Parliaments, Swiss Cantonal Parliaments, and the Canadian House of Commons. He is currently preparing a second edition of his book Proportional Representation - Apportionment Methods and Their Applications with a foreword Andrew Duff (Springer by International Publishing, 2014). Professor VICTORIANO RAMÍREZ-GONZÁLEZ, University of Granada, Spain, is head of the research group on electoral methods (GIME Granada). He graduated with a degree in Mathematics from the University of Granada in 1977, and received his PhD in Mathematics in 1980. He is a full Professor at the University of Granada since 1986. He has been a vice-Dean for Research in the Faculty of Science (University of Granada) between 1985-1987 and president of the Department of Applied Mathematics between 1988-2000. Since 1995, he is the Head of the research group on analysis and design of electoral systems.

He has published in several international journals among which are Electoral Studies, Mathematical Social Science, Annals of Operation Research, Mathematical Modelling, Polena, Ciencia Política, and Representation. He has worked on the analysis of the electoral systems of Spain, Mexico, Sweden, Germany, Italian, the European Parliament's elections and Ecuador.

Dr Hab. WOJCIECH SŁOMCZYŃSKI, is adjunct professor in the Institute of Mathematics and the chair of the academic board of the Center for Quantitative Research in Political Science at the Jagiellonian University in Cracow. His research interests include dynamical systems (in particular: chaos, entropy, and fractals), as well as application of mathematics in quantum information and social choice theory (including systems). Together electoral with Życzkowski, he proposed in 2004 an alternative voting system for the Council of the European Union, known as the 'Jagiellonian Compromise'. In 2011 he was a member of a group of mathematicians and social scientists that prepared a new apportionment scheme for the European Parliament (EP) called the 'Cambridge Compromise'. His recent research concerns the roll-call vote analysis of the national interests in this body.
